Traditional Greetings, Introductions & Recognitions:

The National Trustee's meeting was held on Saturday, March 1, 2025, at the National SAR's Spring Leadership Meeting in Louisville. The meeting began with an opening greeting from President General (PG) Darryl Addington, MD (North Carolina) to the National SAR Staff, General Officers, Vice Presidents General, Trustees, other members of the National Society, and guests of the SAR who were in attendance at the meeting. The PG followed his greetings with the introduction of the National SAR Staff, and the recognition of all first-time attendees, first responders, and military veterans.

The introductions and recognitions were then followed by an announcement regarding a patriot grave marking to be hosted by the Indiana Society on Sunday immediately following the Spring Leadership. The grave marking announcement was followed by the traditional presentation of gifts. The gifts were primarily monetary in nature, and were gifted to a variety of SAR funds. The funds included the SAR Education Center and Museum fund, the General Operating fund, the George Washington Endowment fund, various Youth Contest funds, and the First Lady's project, to which PG Addington gifted an additional \$85,000. He had previously gifted \$50,000 to the First Lady's project. In addition, there were a few pieces of historical memorabilia and books that were also gifted to the SAR Museum, and the SAR Library.

The PG conducted a "swearing in" ceremony for those Trustees in attendance who were not previously sworn in at the last NSSAR Congress in Lancaster, Pennsylvania or during the most recent Fall Leadership. The PG then introduced all previous Presidents General (PG's) that were in attendance and allowed each of them to address the audience. Several just offered a welcome, while others spoke on a specific topic including:

- The promotion to Spring Leadership attendees of tourist attractions in the city of Louisville
- The ongoing effort by the National Genealogical Society to digitize all Revolutionary War records
- A presentation of the upcoming 2025 Congress in Uncasville, Connecticut

The PG also reminded attendees (where applicable), to complete their Youth Protection Training, and to submit their conflict of interest statements. Lastly, the minutes of the last Trustees Meeting were approved.

Executive Committee Report:

Secretary Elston then asked Jay Deloach to give a report highlighting the SAR's new five-year Strategic Plan. Once Jay's presentation was completed, Secretary Elston called for a vote of the Trustees to approve the Strategic Plan. The vote to approve was unanimous.

All state societies (and their respective chapters) are encouraged to recite the National SAR Mission and Vision Statements at all meetings, and to promote its Core Values.

We will be a leading promoter of the study of the American Revolution and an advocate for our Nation's founding principles.

- Patriotism Demonstrate love, support, and defense of the United States of America
- **Leadership** Inspire others to achieve our mission
- **Education** Inform the public about America's founding history

- **2024** 37,839 (There were 4,000+ non-renewals in 2024)
- **2025** 34,164 (As of March 6, 2025)
